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## Questions to discuss and answer at home for Easter:

1. In John 10:10, Jesus contrasts himself with "the thief." Who or what might "the thief" represent in our lives today, and how does this thief "steal, kill, and destroy"?
2. Jesus says he came that we "may have life, and have it to the full." What does "life to the full" mean in your understanding? How is this different from how the world often defines a full life?
3. Jesus identifies himself as "the good shepherd" who "lays down his life for the sheep." How does this sacrificial image help us understand the purpose of the cross?
4. The disciples witnessed the resurrected Christ. How did their firsthand experience of the resurrection transform their understanding of Jesus' message and mission?
5. The Holy Spirit's power is a reason the disciples were willing to endure suffering. How does the Holy Spirit empower believers today to live the abundant life Jesus promised?
6. The disciples "understood Jesus' message of eternal life." How does the promise of eternal life change how we approach challenges and suffering in our present lives?
