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CITY GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Luke keeps pointing out that this church "used to meet together" — same place, same day, every week. What's a regular gathering in your life (church or otherwise) that you look forward to because you know exactly who'll be there?
2. Verse 13 says no one could join this church casually anymore — it took real nerve to attach to it. Where in your life do you feel like you're "all in" versus just showing up? What's the difference for you?
3. A holy church is magnetic — reverence and attraction rise together, not against each other. Where have you seen something real (not performed) actually draw people in, rather than push them away?
4. Those same carriers had shaky theology — they were chasing a shadow — and God met their friends anyway. Is there someone you've been putting off reaching out to because you don't feel "ready" or "qualified" yet?
5. This week the church was described as awe, together, and carried — reverence, presence, and hands. Which of those three feels like the one God is inviting you into most right now?
